WRITING PROMPT:



The day I caught my first cloud...

When I'm beginning a new story, I start by asking a lot of questions.

Often, some of the answers spark bright ideas – and more questions!

Here are a few questions to get your ideas sparking:

- Where were you when you spotted your cloud?
- What was the weather like that day?
- What made you notice that particular cloud?
- Did you have to catch your cloud, or did it start following you?
- Was anyone else there too? Did they see what happened? If so, how did they react?
- What happened next? Did the weather change?
- How did you feel?

Writing style – how are you going to tell your story?

One of the decisions when writing a story is how you want to tell it? Stories can be told in so many ways!

You could write it as: a diary entry, a letter, a comic strip, a play script, or a short story. If the resulting weather was dramatic, you could even write it as a news report – if so, you'll need a snappy news title using plenty of alliteration!

Most importantly: think big and have fun!
